The Act of Giving

In the temple, there was a section called ‘Court of the Women’, 13 chests, called ‘Chest of Trumpets’ were placed against a wall. These chests were shaped like trumpets, narrow at the mouth and wide at the bottom, hence their name, Nine chests were for receiving what was legally due from worshippers - similar to tithes and offering of today. The other four chests were for voluntary gifts.

Persons would pass by the chests on entering the temple. In them they would drop their money, usually pieces of silver or gold, as their gifts. Some persons would stay afar and toss their money in the chest so that others could hear clinking sound. The more money a person gave, the louder would be the clinking sound. Consequently, some people used their act of giving to show off their financial status.

Jesus sat in the Court of Women and observed the people. He could see clearly how much everyone gave, and He knew the motive. After observing the givers, rich and poor, Jesus drew His disciples attention to the poor widow. ([Mark 12: 41-44](#)) He pointed out that the rich gave significant amounts. unlike the widow.

It was the widow’s giving, however, that He used to teach His disciples and us, a profound lesson on how we should view our possessions.

If we believe our possessions belong to God, we will endeavour to be good stewards, But if we view them as ours instead of God’s, we will only give what we believe we can afford to lose. God commands us to give all we have, in Including ourselves and to be good stewards of His gift to us.

How do you view your resources? Do you see them as your right to possess and use as you desire, or do you see them as a gift from God of which you are duty bound to be a good steward?
