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The Washing Of Feet

Walking in sandals on the dusty roads of Palestine in the first century made it necessary that feet be washed before a communal meal, especially since people reclined at a low table and feet were very much in evidence.

When Jesus rose from the table and began to wash the feet of the disciples (Jn. 13:4 &5), He was doing the work of the lowliest of servants.

In the society at that time, foot washing was reserved for the lowliest of menial servants. A disliked duty to be performed before strangers and travelers entered the house.

The disciples, no doubt must have been stunned at Jesus’ actions. The Lord and Master, should wash the feet of His disciples when they (the disciples), should have washed His.

For the disciples, the washing of their feet was in direct contrast to the attitude of their heart at that time.

For us, washing feet is symbolic of our role in the body of Christ.

Peter was uncomfortable with the Lord washing his feet, and he protested. Then Jesus shocked Peter by saying, “Unless I wash you, you have no part with me”. (Jn.13:8)

Luke points out that the disciples were arguing about who was the greatest among them (Luke 22:24); an attitude that precludes a willingness to stoop to wash feet.

Peers did not wash one another’s feet, except very rarely as a mark of great love.

Jesus’ actions was symbolic of spiritual cleansing, and a model of Christian humility.

By washing His disciples feet, Jesus taught the lesson of selfless service.

Four (4) Ways to value peoples Quirks.

A quirk is a characteristic that makes someone different, but it can also make them special ! Different does not have to be negative, it can also mean valuable.

CONSIDER: 1. Basic temperament, personality, strengths. Not just perceived weaknesses.

2. Spiritual gifts - How the Holy Spirit has gifted the person for ministry. (Rom.12:6-8) 1 Cor.12:4-11
3. Background & experiences. Prayerfully try to understand how this colours their attitudes & behaviour.
4. What do they love? How can this be channelled for God's glory?

What you consider quirks are likely precious and useful in God's sight!

October is the month in which all Baptists come together to celebrate a work that had humble beginnings.

The Planting of a Seed

The Baptist witness of Belize started in 1822 with Christian brothers Caleb & George Fife Angus who were interested in spreading the gospel. Their appeals to the 'Baptist Missionary Society' resulted in the sending of Mr. Joseph Bourne of Bradford Academy & wife from Newcastle upon Tyne, England, to Belize. Their faithful witness gave birth to Queen Street Baptist Church in Belize City. Queen Street because in the early years the entrance to the church was on Queen Street. The work has gone through some changes in its structural organization in subsequent years.

In 1960 the work was transferred to the Conservative Baptist.

In 1976, the Southern Baptists of the United States came in through the Conservative and Rev Otis Brady and his wife Martha were selected as Missionaries to Belize. They arrived in Belize in 1977. They started a mission in Belize City in 1978 which grew into the Calvary Baptist Church. In 1978, the two groups, the Conservative and Southern Baptists were united to form the **Baptist Association of Belize. (BAB)**

This group still exists today.

The ultimate goal of forging all the churches together is to have an autonomous Baptist denomination in Belize that is neither Conservative nor Southern Baptist.
